4th WPTA Singapore International Piano Competition

The World Piano Teachers Association Singapore International Piano Competition (WPTA Singapore IPC) is an online piano competition based on video selection, organised by the national association of WPTA (World Piano Teachers Association) Singapore.

The competition is open to participants of **all nationalities and ages** in the following disciplines:

- 1. INDIVIDUAL**
- 2. PIANO DUO**
- 3. PIANO ENSEMBLE**
Piano four-hands, Piano six-hands, Piano eight-hands
- 4. COLLABORATIVE PIANIST**
- 5. CHAMBER MUSIC**
- 6. PIANO CONCERTO**

APPLICATION DEADLINES

- Last day for submitting applications is on **15 September 2022**
- Winners will be announced on our website on **15 October 2022**

Selected group of winners will receive an invitation to perform at the Gala Concert during the Awards Ceremony in the **Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music (Singapore) on 27th November 2022.**

The competition is divided into sections and categories.

Each section has its relevant age categories and participants are required to observe the time limits of the recording relevant to their category.

Below is the overview of the categories:

Young virtuoso	9-10	Free choice	Up to 10 min
Junior Talent	11-13	Two contrasting pieces	Up to 12 min
Rising Talent	14-16	Two contrasting pieces	Up to 15 min
Emerging	17-20	Two or more contrasting pieces	Up to 20 min
Artist	21 and above	Two or more contrasting pieces	Up to 25

COLLABORATIVE PIANIST

Name	Age	Repertoire
Collaborative Protege	14 and below	One instrumental accompaniment
Collaborative Virtuoso	15-17	One instrumental & One voice accompaniment
Collaborative Master	18 and above	One instrumental & Two voice accompaniments

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CHAMBER MUSIC

Name	Age	Repertoire
Chamber Talents	10 and below	Free choice
Chamber Virtuosi	11-13	Free choice
Chamber Artists	14-17	Free choice
Chamber Masters	18 and above	Free choice

*Category is selected based on the age of the pianist (regardless of age of other members of the ensemble)

PIANO CONCERTO

Name	Age	Repertoire
Concerto Debut	8 and below	1 st movement of a concerto for piano and orchestra (from Baroque or Classical period)
Concerto Talent	9-11	1 st movement of a concerto for piano and orchestra (from Classical, Romantic or 20th century period)
Concerto Virtuoso	12-14	Any two movements of a concerto for piano and orchestra (any period)
Concerto Master	15 and above	Full concerto for piano and orchestra (any period)

VIDEO MATERIAL

Contestants are required to submit video recording materials for the participation. Recording should be a fair representation of the contestants' abilities but does not need to be of a professional quality. Contestants must adhere to repertoire requirements provided at the respective category and age tables. Time limits indicated for each category. It can be shorter but should not be significantly longer as stated for each category.

The programme must be performed by memory for the **Individual** and **Piano Concerto** (applies to the soloist's part only) categories.

AWARDS

- GRAND PRIX (only 1 award across all ages and categories will be awarded)
- Highest prize | Platinum
- 1st prize | Golden award
- 2nd prize | Silver award
- 3rd prize | Bronze award

- Best Youngest Virtuoso Award (awarded in partnership with *North Competition*, Sweden)
- Best Piano Concerto Award
- Best Baroque Award (awarded in partnership with Clavier-Festival "CLAVIS", Bavaria)
- Best Classical Award (awarded in partnership with Clavier-Festival "CLAVIS", Bavaria)
- Best Romantic Award (awarded in partnership with Clavier-Festival "CLAVIS", Bavaria)
- Best Contemporary Award
- Best Collaborative Pianist Prize (awarded by *Chamber Music Society*, Singapore)
- Best Chamber Ensemble Prize (awarded by *Chamber Music Society*, Singapore)
- Recognition Certificates for Teachers (whose students will be selected as winners)

Selected group of winners will receive an invitation to perform at the Gala Concert during the Awards Ceremony in the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music (Singapore) on 27th November 2022.

If for any reason you are unable to attend and perform at the Awards Ceremony we will send the original certificate by registered post to the address indicated in the initial application.

All participants who have not been selected for a Gala Concert will receive the original participation certificate by post. Invited winners that are not able to attend and perform (for any reason) will receive the original participation certificate by post.

ADJUDICATION PANEL

The panel of judges evaluates the video material submitted, and the final selections of winners are based on the same recordings submitted. More information about Jury members can be found on the official website: <http://www.wpta.info/singapore/ipc/>

HOW TO APPLY

To apply for the competition participants must submit

- A completed online application form
- A video recording uploaded online (preferably on YouTube but other platforms are accepted too)
- Application fee
- Resume / CV / Biography (optional)

Please note that the participant retains 100% of the recording rights.

- Last day for submitting applications is on **15 September 2022**
- Winners will be announced on our website on **15 October 2022**

GENERAL RULES

1. Incomplete applications will not be processed
2. Application fee is non-refundable
3. Jury's decision is final and cannot be appealed. However, a comprehensive commentary about video from the jury panel can be provided upon request (in English language only)
4. Multiple winners can be chosen in each of the groups (except Grand Prix)
5. WPTA Singapore reserves the right to make any changes in the rules, schedule and other information related to the award

WINNERS' GALA CONCERT RULES

1. Children under 18 years old shall be under the responsibility of their parents or legal guardians. They must be supervised at all times by their parents or legal guardians.
2. The competition is not responsible for any damage or theft of personal belongings of participants.
3. Participants agree and authorise the organisers of the concert to use the winner's image for any publicity and activity related to the event.
4. During the Gala Concert, participants waive all rights to television broadcasting remuneration. There will be no financial remuneration for their performance.
5. All participants are responsible for their own expenses (travel, accommodations, etc.)
