Music Starter (Book Presentation): A New Method of Learning How to Read Music

Music Starter has been described as "A first-rate music tool that would greatly enhance the way we approach beginners' music instruction" (Dr. Dorian Leljak, WPTA President), "A wonderfully unique book with all the elements to ultimately instill a lifelong love of music!" (Dr. Maria Kotitsa, C Psychol, Regent's College, London, UK), "One of the nicest and most significant achievements of our piano pedagogy" (Rita Kinka, Academy of Arts, Novi Sad). The book is designed to help children learn basic symbols of music notation through playing games (including stickers, cards, a board game, etc.), solving logic problems, reading stories, etc. It encourages children to discover the meaning of each symbol of music notation, enabling them to acquire elemental music literacy in a meaningful, creative, and exciting way. The tasks are carefully organized so that a child gradually moves from what is known to him/her towards the unknown. Mechanical repetition is avoided since each task in a lesson in unique, which helps children gain a more profound understanding of the concepts presented, while maintaining their concentration levels and interest in the book. With each problem solved and game finished, children take one step closer to understanding the essential music parameters and their symbols (rhythm, meter, pitch, registers, etc.).

This PowerPoint presentation will guide you to understand the sitting balance and the weight delivery in terms of the anatomical design of our body, and help you to find the best sitting posture at the piano bench.

How to use movements effectively to convey the music encountered by protecting small hands from injury

Isidor Bajić Music School (Novi Sad)


Ivan Chernukhin is a 5th year student of "Isidor Bajic" music school in Novi Sad, Professor Olga Borzenko's piano class. He was born in 2008 in Ternopil (Ukraine). His musical talent was noticed at a very young age, when he demonstrated a perfect pitch, giving him an uncanny ability to hear music in every ambient sound. During his early childhood Ivan has been exposed to classical music which invoked a huge interest in performing. In 2014 Ivan moved to Serbia with his family where later he started taking piano lessons at the age of 7. Two years later he started studying piano in "Isidor Bajic" music school in Novi Sad under Olga Borzenko. He won his first prize in the International competition in the same year. Ivan achieved excellent results in many competitions in Serbia, including Republic competitions and a well known festival "Isidor Bajic"; several competitions abroad including Young Pianists Carl Maria von Weber in Dresden, Germany, 14th Ars Nova International Music Competition, Trieste, Italy. In addition, Ivan participated in Guinness World Record setting among 23 young people playing grand piano simultaneously. He received multiple Laureate awards in international competitions both in Serbia and abroad. Among them are I. International creative olympiade Yekaterinburg - Dusseldorf, XVIII Davorin Jenko International Competition, the Piano Competition "Slavenski" and VII Slobomir International Music Competition, etc. Ivan is a 4 times Laureate of the Republic competitions.

Bucknell University (Lewisburg, Pennsylvania)





Dr. Elizabeth Crecca is Visiting Assistant Professor of Music in Piano and Theory at Bucknell University. Her research has focused largely on performance practice and its practical applications. She has presented at the MTNA National Conference, University of Oklahoma, Bilkent University Piano Festival, and the 2021 WPC. Her lecture recital on performance practice in Béla Bartók's music was nominated for the Eastman School of Music Lecture Recital Prize. Dr. Crecca holds a Doctor of Musical Arts in Piano Performance and Literature from the Eastman School of Music, a Master of Music in Piano Performance with Baroque Emphasis from the San Francisco Conservatory, and a Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance and Music Theory from the University of Michigan. Her past piano teachers include Natalya Antonova, Yoshikazu Nagai, and Logan Skelton. She studied harpsichord and fortepiano with Corey Jamason and Lisa Crawford, and has performed on period instruments with the American Bach Soloists. Dr. Crecca previously served on faculty at Bradley University, teaching music history and piano. She taught piano at the Eastman School of Music during her doctorate studies, earning a nomination for the Teaching Assistant Prize for Excellence in Teaching.

What Pianists Can Learn from the Harpsichord

Most of the Baroque repertoire performed on piano today, such as the music of J.S. Bach and Domenico Scarlatti, was originally composed for harpsichord. The harpsichord's capabilities differ significantly than those of the piano. The harpsichord does not respond dynamically to the speed at which keys are depressed, yet was the instrument of choice for a large body of emotionally charged compositions. Studying the harpsichord encourages one to reevaluate the

relative importance and application of music's three main expressive areas: dynamics, timing, and articulation. While modern pianists tend to use dynamics as their primary means of expression, the harpsichord demands that timing and articulation be placed on equal or greater footing. When pianists begin to apply the same level of nuance to timing and articulation as they do to dynamics, a vast range of interpretive possibilities opens up—and the harpsichord provides the guidelines for the realization of those possibilities. This presentation involves side-by-side demonstrations and comparisons of expressive techniques on modern piano and harpsichord.

ALEKSANDAR ĐERMANOVIĆ (SERBIA)

Academy of Arts (Novi Sad)

Aleksandar Đermanović is a pianist currently on his Doctoral studies at the Academy of Arts in Novi Sad under the mentorship of Dr Dorian Leljak. He holds a position of an Associate Professor at the Academy of Arts in Novi Sad and a General Manager for the International Piano competition Memorial Isidor Bajić. He has finished a Postgraduate course at the Universitat Mozarteum in Salzburg studying with Jacques Rouvier and the highly prestigious Artist Diploma course at the Royal College of Music in London studying with Ian Jones and Dmitri Alexeev with both of whom he had previously finished his Master studies with distinction. During his time at RCM he has received generous financial support as an ABRSM scholar, Gary and Eleanor Brass Scholar and as a beneficiary of the Henry Wood Trust, Lee Abbey Award and a Leverhulme Postgraduate Studentship. After the studies he held a post as a Junior Fellow at the RCM being awarded the Anthony Saltmarsh Junior Fellowship in piano accompaniment for 2015/16 and has been selected as a Park Lane Young Artist for 2016/2017 with the violinist Eunsley Park. His early and undergraduate musical studies were undertaken in Serbia where his piano Professors were Tatjana Vukmanović and Dorian Leljak respectively, after starting to play the piano at the age of 11. He has performed throughout Europe in venues such as Rachmaninoff Hall (Moscow), in London at Wigmore Hall, St John's Smith Square, Royal Albert Hall, Steinway Hall, Amaryllis Fleming Concert Hall, Purcell Room, Cadogan Hall, Southbank Centre, St. Martin'-inthe-Fields and the French Institute as well as giving many performances at RCM, also at Kolarčeva zadužbina (Belgrade), Pump-room Hall (Bath), Concert Halls of Skandenborg and Viborg (Denmark), Hubad Hall (Ljubljana) and many more.

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Last year, Bill presented a document for the 2021 WPC entitled "Unconventional Rhythmic Notations in the Haitian Méringue" that explained the execution of the Haitian quintolet and Puerto Rican elastic tresillo rhythms. At the 2017 WPC Bill presented "An Assessment of Technical Exercises for Piano Majors" from a completed survey of technique development in undergraduate colleges in the United States. Bill finished his dissertation, "The Haitian Méringue Through Stylized Compositions From 1880 - 1930," this past December from the University of Northern Colorado that analyzed recently published digital compositions of the Haitian Méringue and gave performance practice information for uncommon rhythms used. Bill completed his Master's in Music from Louisiana State University and studied Music Therapy at Colorado State University but did not have the required singing skills. Prior, he received Bachelor's degrees in Computer Engineering and Music from Mississippi State University, where his family has taught since 100 years ago. In 2019 Bill served as the "Color Keyboardist" for the Bigfork Summer Playhouse in Montana. In 2016 he enjoyed traveling across Europe between music festivals in Italy and France, where he received lessons at the Pablo Casals Festival from Olivier Gardon of the Schola Cantorum de Paris.



Performance Practice of Misalignment in Stylized Compositions of the Haitian Méringue

Haitian composers with European education used innovative rhythmic notation to preserve aspects of cross-rhythms from West African musical styles, which treat elements of soloist and support as more independent elements than common Western music. Haitian composers also used other devices in notation to indicate independence between the hands. Understanding the rhythmic philosophies of this style will help to properly perform this widely unknown Caribbean classical music with French and African backgrounds.

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Praised by the New York Concert Review as "in a word, superb," pianist Rixiang Huang has inspired glowing acclaim from audiences and critics alike for his superb artistry and passionate, charismatic performances on four continents. Since winning the first prize at the 12th Chopin International Piano Competition in Hartford and Los Angeles International Liszt Piano Competition in 2021, Huang has rapidly established for himself an international reputation. His first CD album, French Romance, released in April 2020, has already earned accolades from audiences and critics; Steinway Artist Rorianne Schrade remarked that his Debussy "reflect[ed] a special sensitivity, grace, and delicate tonal shading" and his Bartók "may be one of this listener's most enjoyable Bartók Sonata performances to date" (New York Concert Review). Winner of an impressive array of prizes, Huang was a top prizewinner of the Hastings International Piano Concerto Competition, Dallas International Piano Competition, New York International Artists Piano Competition, along with the Jacob Flier

International Piano Competition. He was also a semi-finalist in the prestigious Paloma O'Shea Santander International Piano Competition in 2018. Highlights of the 2020-21 season include a five city solo recital tour in China; solo recital at University of Southern California; chamber music performance at Sarasota Music Festival in Florida; and concerto performance with Chautauqua Symphony Orchestra. An immersive and versatile soloist, Huang has performed extensively all over the world in prestigious venues such as Carnegie Hall in New York, Alice Tully Hall at the Lincoln Center, Universität Mozarteum - Solitär in Austria; Santander Palacio de Festivales de Cantabria in Spain; Hamamatsu ACT Concert Hall in Japan; National Center for the Performing Arts and Beijing Concert Hall in China. His performances have been broadcast by WQXR-FM, Classic FM, Cleveland WCLV 104.9, Sarasota WSMR 89.1 & 103.9, and Corporación de Radio y Televisión Española.

Mr. Huang is represented by Creative Classical Concert Management. As an active soloist, Huang has appeared with leading orchestras around the world including Royal Philharmonic Orchestra in London; China National Symphony Orchestra; Indonesia National Symphony Orchestra; Chautaugua Symphony Orchestra in New York; and Eastern Music Festival Orchestra in North Carolina. He has also appeared as a guest artist with acclaimed string quartet Cuarteto Quiroga and was selected to participate in the Advanced Piano Trio Program by the acclaimed Kalichstein-Laredo-Robinson Trio. In addition, Huang has been a featured artist at Salzburg Summer Academy Mozarteum, Orford Music Academy, Bowdoin International Music Festival in Maine, Chautaugua Music Festival, Art of the Piano at the University of Cincinnati, Piano Texas, and Pianofest in the Hamptons. He has performed alongside preeminent conductors such as Jac Van Steen, Joel Smirnoff, Earl Lee, Eric Garcia, and has performed in master classes with Sergei Babayan, Stephen Hough, Arie Vardi, Veda Kaplinsky, Dimitry Alexeev, Pavel Gililov, among others. Huang is a DMA candidate and graduate teaching assistant at the USC Thornton School of Music, studying with prestigious conductor and pianist, Jeffrey Kahane. He is currently a member of MTNA (Music Teachers National Association). Huang received a Master of Music in Piano Performance at The Juilliard School, studying with legendary pianists, Jerome Lowenthal and Matti Raekallio. Previously, he worked with world renowned pianists, Antonio Pompa-Baldi and Paul Schenly at The Cleveland Institute of Music, where he was awarded the Arthur Loesser Memorial Prize for outstanding achievement in piano performance. A Seat at the Piano (ASAP): A Global Perspective on Diversity in the Piano Repertoire

A Seat at the Piano (ASAP) is a resource that promotes and advocates for the inclusion, study, and performance of a more equitably representative body of piano works. The organization seeks to amplify those voices which have been historically marginalized in America, voices which have been speaking but to whom we have not been listening. In addition to an overview of the resource and website, this presentation poses the question of how ASAP can be utilized on a global perspective where equity, diversity, and inclusion look very different in various cultural contexts around the world.

Royal College of Music (London)

lan Jones FRCM is Professor of Piano and Deputy Head of Keyboard at the Royal College of Music in London. In May 2014 Fellowship of the Royal College of Music was conferred on him by HRH Prince Charles. His career as a Steinway Artist has taken him to all five continents. Appearances with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra and National Symphony Orchestra at London's Royal Festival Hall and Barbican Hall include critically acclaimed performances of Rachmaninov's Second and Third Piano Concertos and Paganini Rhapsody as well as concertos by Beethoven, Tchaikovsky, Grieg and Schumann. He has appeared in Paris and throughout France as concerto soloist with the Ensemble International and has performed many of Mozart's piano concertos in Europe and USA. A prizewinner at the Leeds International Piano Competition, he also won many prizes, including the prestigious Chappell Medal, whilst a student at RCM. Other awards include the Vlado Perlemuter Piano Prize and a special scholarship from the French government inviting him to spend a year in Paris. His teachers included Maria Curcio, Gyorgy Sebok, Phyllis Sellick, Jerome Lowenthal and Alain Planès. He has broadcast for radio and television networks in many different countries and his World Première performances and recordings of music by British composer Rebecca Clarke (on Dutton Digital) have received much enthusiastic attention on radio and in the music press. In 2017 he discussed and performed Clarke's music on BBC Radio 3's Composer of the Week, in a week of programmes dedicated to her. On the release of his CD, Chopin: Summer in Nohant (London Independent Records), Classic FM magazine drew comparison with Rubinstein and Arrau and claimed that "Jones possesses the 'pearl' touch that marks out the finest Chopin exponents...his timing remains immaculate whatever the technical pressure." International Piano praised "some magically veiled sonorities and exquisite pianissimo...reminiscent of 1970s Pollini" and noted he "knows exactly how far to allow phrases room to dream and breathe before being gently reined back into focus." Gramophone praised his ability to "transform passages often treated as superficial rhetoric into something thoughtful and communing" and BBC Music Magazine described his playing as having "a lyrical elegance and unselfconscious purity of expression." He was piano coach, music advisor and composer/performer on the Oscarnominated film Hilary and Jackie and has also written and performed music for France's two national theatres in Paris and Strasbourg. Ian Jones is much sought-after as a teacher and his students have enjoyed international success. He is Artistic Director of the World Piano Teachers Association International Piano Competition and often serves on the juries of other international piano competitions. He frequently examines and adjudicates at other leading conservatoires, including the Royal Academy of Music in London and regularly performs and conducts international masterclasses, most recently in China, Sweden, USA, Serbia, Japan, Ireland, Greece, Italy and Russia and at conservatoires such as Sweden's Royal College of Music and many keyboard faculties in USA. Since 2018 he has been Guest Artist at Virtuoso & Belcanto Music Festival in Lucca, Italy and at Gotland Chamber Music Festival, Sweden. In 2019 he was Guest Artist at Maestro Art Taiwan and Hainan International Piano Festival in China. In summer 2019 he joined the faculty of Amalfi Coast Music & Arts Festival, Oxford International Piano Festival and Chethams International Piano Summer School. 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Pianist and innovative educationalist, Carmel Liertz, is an international performance coach with backgrounds in Performance, Performance Education, and Performance Research. Performance and pedagogy studies were undertaken in Australia and at Munich's Hochschule fur Musik und Theater. Two decades later, as guest at six leading performance institutions in Germany and Austria, she experienced the teaching styles and conversations with renowned performer-teachers Klaus Schilde, Pavel Gililov, Alfons Kontarsky, and Paul Badura-Skoda. Later, a master lesson with Prof. Lev Vlassenko to trial videoconference technology for music performance proved so successful, that this led Carmel to apply for a university grant to pioneer Videoconferencing for Music Performance in Australia. Her thesis 'Developing Performance Confidence: A Holistic Training Strategies Program for Managing Practice and Performance in Music' is reflected in her two books/ebooks - 'Performance Confidence: (2009; 2012) and 'Revolutionary Etudes: (2021; 2022). Her 'pioneering mind-body awareness programme' has been featured twice in International Piano Magazine - most recently in 2018 Sept/Oct Issue No. 51 - 'In Mind And In Body'.



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How to Overcome Overwhelm - So You Perform at Your Best

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The present clash of world challenges is affecting people worldwide with feelings of overwhelm. This topic is discussed in business, but is not so apparent in health and education, though the state of overwhelm can easily diminish health, self-belief and confidence, affecting musicians' work performance and performance ability. This presentation suggests that being 'process-focused' rather than 'outcome-focused' assists to address the complexities performance presents, thereby increasing confidence, and diminishing stress and anxiety that generally appear with overwhelm. Liertz's 'process' approach for performance complements her health-oriented mental and physical strategies program, both outlined in her thesis and books. By focusing on the task at hand with mind-body health maintenance, one can learn to manage and overcome overwhelm, whenever it appears.



A student of Jenny Shin, Ingrid Luo is a senior at Sage Hill School in Southern California. She was introduced to piano at age 7 and soon noted for her interest and talent in music. She has been a prize winner of both national and international piano competitions, including National YoungArts Foundation, WPTA Finland International Piano Competition, ENKOR International Music Competition, and LA international Liszt Competition. 
Moving Forward: COVID Teaching Practices for the Post-COVID World

As the world moves away from the "new normal" and life begins to resemble something that not long ago felt like a distant memory, many piano teachers have made the transition back to in-person instruction. However, the last two-and-a-half years in a pandemic have made their mark on teachers. In April 2022, I administered a qualitative survey to a global population of pre-college piano teachers to identify basic trends and practices that emerged from instructional adaptations made necessary by the transition to virtual instruction. This presentation discusses the findings of that survey and distills those findings into suggestions for continued implementation of strategies such as virtual instruction, the use of recording technology, and examines teacher perception of the lessons learned from a long period of forced adaptation.



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University of North Carolina-Charlotte (Charlotte)



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Dylan Savage, D.M., is a Bösendorfer Concert Artist, a Capstone Records recording artist, a winner of the Rome Festival Orchestra Competition, and Professor of Piano at the University of North Carolina-Charlotte. Dr. Savage is the author of the recent book *The Transposed Musician: Teaching Universal Skills to Improve Performance and Benefit Life* (GIA Publications). He is co-author of the popular piano pedagogy book *A Symposium for Pianists and Teachers: Strategies to Develop the Mind and Body for Optimal Performance* (Heritage Music Press). Savage's numerous music-related articles have appeared in Clavier, Clavier Companion, American Music Teacher, Pianoforte, and Piano Magazine. He has performed and lectured throughout the U.S. and around the world. His topics include: movement efficiency at the keyboard, wellness for musicians, entrepreneurship skills for musicians, and universal skills for musicians. Additionally, he teaches universal skills for *non*-musicians (via live piano performance) in the UNC-Charlotte Honors College. Dr. Savage holds music degrees from Oberlin Conservatory and Indiana University Jacobs School of Music.

The Role of the Music Teacher is Much Bigger than We Thought

The traditional and time-honored role of the music teacher is universally recognized and loved. Yet, after many centuries, it is time to consider a larger purpose for music teaching. What benefits might the profession and the world of music gain? How many music teachers yearn to expand their roles? What might an expanded role look like? How many music teachers feel that their love of teaching and/or their studio could use some revitalization? Dylan Savage has been using live music performance to teach universal and life skills to his music students and to non-musicians for over thirty years. This short talk and demonstration will provide a sample of the expanded purpose of the music teacher.



Lennis Hoi Shing Cheng was born in 2012 and raised in Hong Kong, started playing piano at the age of five. Furthermore Lennis was also awarded excellent prizes in the international competitions in 2022; including the 1st Runner-up at Chopin Avenue International Piano Spring Competition; the 1st Prize Award with 99.75 mark at Four Notes International Piano Competition; the Silver Award at The 8th Singapore Raffles International Music Festival Virtual 2022; and the Absolute Award with scholarship prize at The 4th WPTA Finland International Piano Competition.

JOSÉ JESUS DE AZEVEDO SOUZA (PORTUGAL)

José Jesus de Azevedo Souza studied in England at the Purcell School with a scholarship from the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation. He then studied at the Trinity College of Music and the University of Sheffield. Since then he has given numerous solo, chamber and orchestral performances in Portugal, England, Thailand, the United States and Austria. His music draws from various folk tunes to mathematical principles, from the minute to the expansive in a broad array of vocal and instrumental works. His music has been performed in festivals and conferences in America, Austria, Brazil, Brunei, Bulgaria, England, Germany, Indonesia, Japan, New Zealand, Philippines, Poland, Portugal and Thailand, in addition to having been performed in concert in Canada, Denmark, France, Greece, Holland, Italy, Norway, Spain and Switzerland as well as winning the oboe category of the World Contest in Composition for Peace later performed at the 70th Anniversary of the United Nations Association in London. His music has met critical acclaim in Asia, Europe, North and South America and the Pacific.

Vast sky for piano

Piano music forms the basis of the composer's music, ranging from one minute solo works such as A musical moment, medium sized works such as his Rhapsody, as integral part of an ensemble such as his On Weddell Sea Woodwind and Piano or as soloist as in his Destinos for Piano and Orchestra. Vast Sky was thought for the World Piano Conference and features dense chords and clusters amidst inner propulsion across a broad canvass, conveying a sense of space and serenity.

PETRA SPASOJEVIĆ (SERBIA)

Isidor Bajić Music School (Novi Sad)

Petra Spasojević was born on the 22nd of December, 2004 in Kuršumlija. Due to the need for special education, caused by the commonly named "incubator blindness", at the age of six she moved to Novi Sad to attend classes at the elementary school "Dr. Milan Petrović." Petra was inclusively involved in regular classes at the elementary school "Sonja Marinković", which she successfully completed in the 2018/2019 school year. In 2014, she enrolled in the Music School "Isidor Bajić", in Novi Sad, to study piano lessons in Ana Frlin's class. At this moment, Petra is a second-grade student at the "Isidor Bajić" Music High School. During her previous seven years of schooling, Petra participated in numerous domestic and international piano competitions, where she won the highest recognitions and awards. Of all awards, she would highlight the "Special Award for Author's Work", which is the first prize in the international competition for her composition in 2020. In addition, the maximum number of points on most competitions and two laureate titles at the "Festival of Pianism" in Sremska Mitrovica and the "Festival Isidor Bajić" in Novi Sad can also be added to the list of her achievements. There is a large number of performances behind Petra's huge success, and this love for the stage motivates her to improve herself and conquer the hearts of the audience with her music. Consequently, as her most triumphant debut, she particularly singles out her first solo concert in her town



Kuršumlija, when she was only twelve. In 2019, at the age of 14, she performed as a soloist accompanied by the Youth Philharmonic in the Novi Sad Synagogue, under the baton of a conductor Tamara Adamov Petijević. Then, in 2020, as a representative of Serbia, she performed at the competition "Virtuosos V4 + We play in the same language" in Budapest, where she won two major awards, "The Special Award and The Audience Award". Afterwards, she performed at Kolarac, at the concert of a world-renowned violinist Nemanja Radulivić. Furthermore, in May 2021, she held a concert in Niš, accompanied by the Niš Symphony Orchestra and conducted by Milena Injac. In September 2022, she held a concert in North Macedonia and for the first time at the concert she performed her piano cover of the Macedonian folk song in the style of classical music "Majedonsko Devojče" and delighted the audience. At the concert, which was six days after the concert in Macedonia, in Novi Sad, Serbia, she held a concert within the Kaleidoscope of Culture, which was supported by the European Capital of Culture Novi Sad 2022, and showed all her talents. While collaborating with a composer Dorotea Vejnović, Petra enters the world of composition and hopes that her works will soon reach larger audiences. Her wish is to grow as a pianist and a composer, and to show the world how boundaries and prejudice can be broken when you sincerely love what you do.



Slobodanka Stević was born in Novi Sad, where she graduated from the high school of music Isidor Bajić, class of Prof. Eleonora Mali, and graduated and completed her Master's studies at the Academy of Arts in Novi Sad, class of Dr. Dorian Leljak. She is currently pursuing her Doctoral studies in chamber music in the class of prof. Sonja Antunić. As a pianist, she attendant masterclass of eminent pedagogues: Dusan Trbojevic, Kemal Gekic, Nevena Popovic, Jokut Mihajlović, Iris Kobal, Ninoslav Živković, Svetlana Bogino, Vladimir Ogarkov, Sergey Markarov, Edward Turgeon, Yuval Admony, Tami Kazanawa and others. She performed as a soloist or as a chamber musician in more than 20 countries around the world. Since 2003, she has been engaged at the Academy of Arts in Novi Sad, first as an associate in piano lessons, then as an associate in the string department, as well as in the percussion department. On several occasions, she worked as an official piano collaborator at numerous seminars of string pedagogues: Dejan Mihajlović, Igor Kuret-Kuretija, Dejan Bogdanović, Meguma Teshima etc. Slobodanka Stević made a large number of music recordings for RTS, RTV, RNS, Studio M, Television Vatican, RT San Marino, Israel TV, HRT. Since 2005, she has been a member of the piano duo Ingmar with his colleague, pianist Aleksandar

Gligić. They have performed numerous world premieres of works by domestic and foreign composers, won international awards and special prizes at international competitions. Stević is part of the ensemble Orfelin, Novi Sad Trio, as well as Boris Kovac & New Ritual Group. In addition to being a professor at the Isidor Bajić Music School, she is engaged part-time in the Serbian National Theater and the Vojvodina Symphony Orchestra. She has recorded for several CD releases: Petrovaradinska svita, Ingmar- Hesitation, Anamnesis, Catalogue of memories, Times of day, Ingmar-contemporary Serbian music for 2 pianos, Contemporary composition in Vojvodina, New Ritual Group etc. She is currently preparing a new CD with music by contemporary Serbian composers for 4 hands-all pieces are written and dedicated to piano duo Ingmar. More important awards: Tel Hai piano price, International competition "Chopin Roma" 1st prize, Sergio Calligaris - special award for the best performance of a contemporary piece, semi-finalist of the competition "Allegro vivo" San Marino, winner of the annual award of the Association of Music and Ballet Pedagogues of Serbia for 2010, as well as the "Iskra" award for contemporary creativity of artists up to the age of 35, presented by the Institute for Culture of Vojvodina.

She is the founder of the association IngmArt, whose projects have been supported by the Ministry of Culture of Serbia, the Province and the City for many years. She is a licensed professor for Royal programs at ABRSM South-East Europe. She actively performs concerts as a chamber musician with numerous artists - Edin Karamazov, Novi Sad Wind Quintet, TAJJ Quartet, Ensemble CAMERATA



ACADEMICA etc. Her students are winners of numerous awards and recognitions at national and international competitions and successful students of many recognized music institutions aroud the world. Slobodanka Stević is the promoter of KAWAI pianos of Serbia.

Trio Novi Sad consists of three prominent Novi Sad artists **Ksenija Mijatović Korom** (flute), **Veronika Antunović** (oboe) and **Slobodanka Stević** (piano). Their common love for chamber music encouraged them to form this chamber ensemble in 2013, and since then, they have held concerts in both Serbia (Novi Sad) and abroad. The concert tours in northern Italy in 2016 (Udine, Padua), 2017 (Udine, Malborghetto) and 2019 (Venice) especially stand out. The repertoire of this chamber ensemble includes works from different stylistic epochs, with a special emphasis on original works written for this ensemble. The Novi Sad Trio is very proud of the collaboration with the young Banja Luka composer David Mastikosa, who dedicated his work 'Behind truck' to this chamber ensemble.

Night of Heroines

The 'Night of Heroines', an up-to-date project called after the Heroines programme arch, represents an innovative introduction of classical music to public audience. The project organizer, Slobodanka-Boba Stević, the artist, is a well-known influencer on Instagram and the founder of the 'Bo Inside' concept. The 'Night of Heroines' project represents a synthesis of her work on the Internet and her artistic work. The project was conceived for women as an innovative evening of classical chamber music.

Dina Šuklar Wiesike holds degrees in Piano Performance from Syracuse University, NY, USA (M.Mus) and Novi Sad University Academy of Arts, Serbia (B.A.), where she studied under the tutelage of Wei-Yi Yang and Dorian Leljak, respectively. During her studies she was recognized with the most prestigious awards of both universities (the Academy of Arts Best Student Award in 2002; the University of Novi Sad Best Student Award in 2003; the Hira Poncha Memorial Award; the Elizabeth Garnach Memorial Award, etc.), and was awarded numerous competitive scholarships (Serbian Ministry of Education Student Scholarship, Privrednik Student Scholarship, Syracuse University Scholarship, UK Connections Fund Protégé, Norwegian Government Promising Talent Award for Serbian Students, etc.). As a regular participant of international master classes, she has also worked under Peter Frankel, John O'Conor, Emanuel Krasowsky, Arbo Valdma, Jokut Mihajlovic, Rita Kinka, etc., and was engaged as a Teaching Assistant at master classes led by Dorian Leljak (Professor at the Royal College of Music, London, and Novi Sad Academy of Arts). Ms. Suklar has made a number of permanent recordings for Radio Television of Serbia, Radio Belgrade and Radio Television Novi Sad. In addition to piano playing and performing, Dina remains passionately dedicated to piano teaching. Together with her former piano teacher, Milena Apic, she authored and

fully illustrated a music book for young beginners *Music Starter*, described as "one of the most significant achievements of Serbian piano pedagogy" (Rita Kinka, Academy of Arts in Novi Sad, Serbia), "a wonderfully unique book with all the elements to become an effective learning tool – for children and adult beginners alike! – and ultimately instill a life-long love of music" (Dr. Maria Kotitsa, Regent's College, London, UK), and "a book I only wish I had had when I was a child" (Nancy Lee Harper, Universidade de Aveiro, Portugal). She is currently employed at Isidor Bajic Music School, where she teaches piano. Her students have won numerous prizes at national and international piano competitions. She is a member of the Publishing Board under the authority of the Union of Music Schools of Serbia. She was one of the initiators and coordinators of the successful collaboration between Norfolk Music Service, and Isidor Bajic Music School from Novi Sad, which continuities to thrive. She is a member of EPTA (European Piano Teachers Association), and Music Pedagogues of Serbia Association.

Music Starter (Book Presentation): A New Method of Learning How to Read Music

Music Starter has been described as "A first-rate music tool that would greatly enhance the way we approach beginners' music instruction" (Dr. Dorian Leljak, WPTA President), "A wonderfully unique book with all the elements to ultimately instill a lifelong love of music!" (Dr. Maria Kotitsa, C Psychol, Regent's College, London, UK), "One of the nicest and most significant achievements of our piano pedagogy" (Rita Kinka, Academy of Arts, Novi Sad). The book is designed to help children learn basic symbols of music notation through playing games (including stickers, cards, a board game, etc.), solving logic problems, reading stories, etc. It encourages children to discover the meaning of each symbol of music notation, enabling them to acquire elemental music literacy in a meaningful, creative, and exciting way. The tasks are carefully organized so that a child gradually moves from what is known to him/her towards the unknown. Mechanical repetition is avoided since each task in a lesson in unique, which helps children gain a more profound understanding of the concepts presented, while maintaining their concentration levels and interest in the book. With each problem solved and game finished, children take one step closer to understanding the essential music parameters and their symbols (rhythm, meter, pitch, registers, etc.).

Zvjezdan Vojvodić born 2003, Croatia, is a student of professor-advisor Ivanka Kordić at the Vatroslav Lisinski High School of Music in Zagreb. Zvjezdan is the winner of over 80 first and special awards at national and international competitions. On Croatian state competitions he won the first prizes for piano solo in 2015., 2017., 2019. and 2021. and for piano duo in 2016. and 2019. In 2015, 2016. and 2017. in Slovenia "Koroško piano competition" he won the first prizes and the special awards for the best performed musical pieces of classicism. In 2016. and 2019. in Belgrade, Serbia (Davorin Jenko competition) Zvjezdan was declared the competition laureate. In the year 2016. he also won first prizes in Hungary, "Danubia talents" and in Italy in Cortemilia, "Premio Vittoria Caffa Righetti". In 2017, Zvjezdan won first prizes on "Merci maestro" (Brussels, Belgium) and on International piano competition "Jurica Murai" (Varaždin, Croatia) where he was declared the competition laureate. In November 2017. he won 50th annual international piano competition "Virtuosi per musica di pianoforte" in Czech Republic, Ústí nad Labem, where he was declared the overall winner and won

several special prizes. As a laureate of that competition, he performed Chopin concert in f minor with North Bohemian Orchestra on the 51st competition opening ceremony in 2018. In December 2017, Zvjezdan won the first absolute prize on 12° Ars nova Trieste International Music Festival (Italy) and 2nd prize at the Cesar Franck piano competition in Kraainem, Belgium. In 2018 Zvjezdan won the first prize in "Isidor Bajić" piano competition in Novi Sad, Serbia. In 2019. in the EPTA competition in Croatia he has won first prize. He has performed as a soloist and as a member of a piano duo throughout Croatia and Europe. As a soloist, he has performed with the North Bohemian Orchestra in the Czech Republic and with the Karlovac Chamber Orchestra. Zvjezdan was declared as the best young musician in the 2019/20120 season in the cycle of concerts of young musicians organized by Jeunesses Musicales Croatia, Split, Croatia. In the period of restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, from the autumn of 2020 he participates in online competitions in different age categories in different European countries. He won 17 first prizes and was even declared a laureate six times. Zvjezdan is the winner of two Oscars of knowledge from the Ministry of Science and Education in Croatia. From the school year 2020/21. he is a scholarship holder of the City of Zagreb for excellence.

As a scholarship holder of the Anne-Sophie Mutter foundation and winner of the ECHO Classic award, double bassist Dominik Wagner is presenting his instrument from a new perspective on an international basis. He won prizes at almost all double bass competitions, including the renowned ARD Music Competition, the Eurovision Young Musicians Competition and the International Bradetich Competition. As a soloist Dominik played with many orchestras, such as the BR-Symphony Orchestra, the WDR-Symphony Orchestra and the German Chamber Philharmonic Orchestra Bremen in prestigious concert halls, among them the Musikverein Wien, Konzerthaus Wien, Konzerthaus Berlin, Herkulessaal München and the Elbphilharmonie Hamburg. The highlights of 2021 were the release of his first Solo CD "Giovanni Bottesini - Revolution of Bass" with the Label Berlin Classics, performances of Georg Breinschmid's double bass concerto with the Württembergisches Kammerorchester Heilbronn and the Camerata Salzburg and multiple world premieres, one of them by Wolfram Wagner at the Elbphilharmonie Hamburg. An important part of his career is

expanding and enriching the repertoire for double bass. This led to numerous premieres of concertos, chamber music and pieces for double bass solo. Furthermore, he regularly arranges music by composers ranging from J.S. Bach all the way to George Gershwin. Besides his engagements as a soloist, Dominik shows great passion for playing chamber music. In addition to the standard pieces, he creates new constellations and explores new repertoire. Consequently, he formed the duo with the jazz-double bassist Georg Breinschmid and the clarinet trio with Vera Karner and Aurelia Visovan, which was awarded with the "Fanny Mendelssohn Förderpreis". Despite his young age, Dominik is also a sought-after pedagogue. As such, he regularly gives masterclasses in different parts of Europe (Austria, Germany, Sweden, Holland, UK) and the US. Born in Vienna in 1997 he started his musical education at the age of 5, at first as a cellist, later as a double bassist. Another important musical influence was being part of the Vienna Boys Choir from 2007 to 2011. In the year 2009 he started studying at the University of Music and Performing Arts Vienna with Josef Niederhammer and Werner Fleischmann, as of 2015 onwards at the University of Music in Nürnberg with Dorin Marc.
