Music Starter (Book Presentation): A New Method of Learning How to Read Music

Music Starter has been described as "A first-rate music tool that would greatly enhance the way we approach beginners' music instruction" (Dr. Dorian Leljak, WPTA President), "A wonderfully unique book with all the elements to ultimately instill a lifelong love of music!" (Dr. Maria Kotitsa, C Psychol, Regent's College, London, UK), "One of the nicest and most significant achievements of our piano pedagogy" (Rita Kinka, Academy of Arts, Novi Sad). The book is designed to help children learn basic symbols of music notation through playing games (including stickers, cards, a board game, etc.), solving logic problems, reading stories, etc. It encourages children to discover the meaning of each symbol of music notation, enabling them to acquire elemental music literacy in a meaningful, creative, and exciting way. The tasks are carefully organized so that a child gradually moves from what is known to him/her towards the unknown. Mechanical repetition is avoided since each task in a lesson in unique, which helps children gain a more profound understanding of the concepts presented, while maintaining their concentration levels and interest in the book. With each problem solved and game finished, children take one step closer to understanding the essential music parameters and their symbols (rhythm, meter, pitch, registers, etc.).



The two members of the Görög Sisters Piano Duo, Noémi Görög and Enikő Görög, were born as ethnic Hungarians in Subotica, Serbia, where they completed the Music School before starting their studies in Belgrade at the University of Arts, Faculty of Music in the class of Professor Ninoslav Živković, a descendant of the piano school of Heinrich Neuhaus. Both artists received their DLA degrees at the same institution, supervised by the same professor. Noémi currently teaches at the Hungarian Language Teacher Training Faculty in Subotica, while Enikő is a teacher at the Bartók Béla Faculty of Arts at the University of Szeged (Hungary). They have been performing as a piano duo since 2004. Their repertoire includes the most significant pieces of the four-hands and two-pianos literature. Their focus on contemporary composers is a special treat for their audience, some pieces have been composed specially for their duo. Beside the classical repertoire the duo regularly performs at prestigious festivals of contemporary music, e.g. the arTRIUM Festival of the Hungarian Radio, and the Day of Listening organized by András Keller, the leader of Concerto Budapest. Recently they worked with Péter Eötvös on his work Lisztomania. They released two albums so far: Let's Play (2015) and Let's Dance (2019). "The Görög Sisters are in perfect harmony. Dr. Bill Harned grew up across the street from his grandfather who served in the Mississippi legislature and ran a dairy farm. Bill recently joined the faculty at Mississippi State in his hometown to help with their Community School. At MSU Bill received a B.S. in Computer Engineering, then returned for a B.A. in Music. He then finished his M.A. from Louisiana State University, studying with Michael Gurt. In Neurological Music Therapy, he had completed credits at Colorado State University. Nearby, he achieved his D.A. from the University of Northern Colorado, studying primarily with Adam Zukiewicz. His dissertation exposes recently published digital editions of Haitian music from the SRDMH Archive in Montreal (www.srdmh.com). For the 2022 World Piano Conference Bill presented "Performance Practice of Misalignment in Stylized Compositions of the Haitian Méringue." At the 2023 MTNA National Conference, he presented the same lecture. Just recently, he presented in Montreal at the symposium "Valorisation des répertoires musicaux classiques afro-diasporique.".

Tresillo-Based Rhythms in Art Music Compositions of the Caribbean and a Quantitative Categorization for Syncopated Rhythms

The Cuban cinquillo, the Puerto Rican elastic tresillo type-B, and the Haitian quintolet rhythms appear to all represent transcriptions of the tresillo-based five-beat syncopated rhythm. The quintolet and elastic tresillo rhythms indicate a more relaxed syncopation to allow greater fluctuation of shorter notes, which appropriates lyrical musical textures with slower tempos and rubato treatment of melodies.



With misalignment to the duple meter, these two rhythms also preserve Afrocentric cross-rhythms to support independence between duple and triple rhythms. Use of the common cinquillo rhythm synchronizes duple and tresillobased triple voices to disallow cross-rhythms. By comparing the ratios of the first two notes (Syncopation Ratio), one can distinguish between relaxed and sharp syncopations, which each have their own benefits. This system can also can be applied to the syncopated rhythms of the swing and amphibrach rhythms. This duality can, not only apply to speech and body rhythms, but also apply to rhythms of melody and support.

lan Jones FRCM is Professor of Piano and Deputy Head of Keyboard at the Royal College of Music in London. In May 2014 Fellowship of the Royal College of Music was conferred on him by HRH Prince Charles. His career as a Steinway Artist has taken him to all five continents. Appearances with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra and National Symphony Orchestra at London's Royal Festival Hall and Barbican Hall include critically acclaimed performances of Rachmaninov's Second and Third Piano Concertos and Paganini Rhapsody as well as concertos by Beethoven, Tchaikovsky, Grieg and Schumann. He has appeared in Paris and throughout France as concerto soloist with the Ensemble International and has performed many of Mozart's piano concertos in Europe and USA. A prizewinner at the Leeds International Piano Competition, he also won many prizes, including the prestigious Chappell Medal, whilst a student at RCM. Other awards include the Vlado Perlemuter Piano Prize and a special scholarship from the French government inviting him to spend a year in Paris. His teachers included Maria Curcio, Gyorgy Sebok, Phyllis Sellick, Jerome Lowenthal and Alain Planès. He has broadcast for radio and television networks in many different countries and his World Première performances and recordings of music by British composer Rebecca Clarke (on Dutton Digital) have received much enthusiastic attention on radio and in the music press. In 2017 he discussed and performed Clarke's music on BBC Radio 3's Composer of the Week, in a week of programmes dedicated to her. On the release of his CD, Chopin: Summer in Nohant (London Independent Records), Classic FM magazine drew comparison with Rubinstein and Arrau and claimed that "Jones possesses the 'pearl' touch that marks out the finest Chopin exponents...his timing remains immaculate whatever the technical pressure." International Piano praised "some magically veiled sonorities and exquisite pianissimo...reminiscent of 1970s Pollini" and noted he "knows exactly how far to allow phrases room to dream and breathe before being gently reined back into focus." Gramophone praised his ability to "transform passages often treated as superficial rhetoric into something thoughtful and communing" and BBC Music Magazine described his playing as having "a lyrical elegance and unselfconscious purity of expression." He was piano coach, music advisor and composer/performer on the Oscar-nominated film Hilary and Jackie and has also written and performed music for France's two national theatres in Paris and Strasbourg. Ian Jones is much sought-after as a teacher and his students have enjoyed international success. He is Artistic Director of the World Piano Teachers Association International Piano Competition and often serves on the juries of other international piano competitions. He frequently examines and adjudicates at other leading conservatoires, including the Royal Academy of Music in London and regularly performs and conducts international masterclasses, most recently in China, Sweden, USA, Serbia, Japan, Ireland, Greece, Italy and Russia and at conservatoires such as Sweden's Royal College of Music and many keyboard faculties in USA. Since 2018 he has been Guest Artist at Virtuoso & Belcanto Music Festival in Lucca, Italy and at Gotland Chamber Music Festival, Sweden. In 2019 he was Guest Artist at Maestro Art Taiwan and Hainan International Piano Festival in China. In summer 2019 he joined the faculty of Amalfi Coast Music & Arts Festival, Oxford International Piano Festival and Chethams International Piano Summer School. In July 2022 he will also be on the faculty of Music Fest Perugia, Italy. "A fine sense of line, volatility and rapt concentration informs lan Jones's performances" Classicalsource.com

MARIJANA KOKANOVIĆ MARKOVIĆ (SERBIA)

Academy of Arts (Novi Sad)

Marijana Kokanović Marković, full time Professor in the Department of Musicology and Ethnomusicology at the Academy of Arts in Novi Sad. She graduated both in Music Pedagogy and Musicology from the Academy of Arts in Novi Sad, where she also received her M.A. and Ph.D in Musicology. She has taken part in conferences in the country and abroad, and has published many papers as well as lexicography articles for the Serbian Biographical Dictionary, the Serbian Encyclopedia, Grove Music Online and Österreichisches Musiklexikon. She published a monograph "The Social Role of Salon Music in the Lives and System of Values of the Serbian Citizens in the 19th Century" and she is co-author with Lada Duraković on the book "Franz Lehár - Bandmaster of the Imperial and Royal Navy in Pula (1894-1896)". The focus of her scientific interests is 19th century music and especially popular genres (salon music, operetta) in Serbian, Balkan and European contexts. She has participated in projects in the country and abroad (Universität für Musik und darstellende Kunst, Wien; Institut für Musikwissenschaft der Universität Leipzig; Archivi Sonori del Friuli Venezia Giulia; National University of Music, Bucharest etc.). She completed specialization courses in Vienna and Leipzig.

Lecture: Jovan Paču: "Serbian Sounds", Rhapsodies for Piano (edited by Marijana Kokanović Marković), Matica srpska 2022 (*lecture in Serbian)

Various branches of the prolific and creative personality of a doctor and musician Jovan Paču (1847–1902) intertwined, which gave him a prominent place in the history of 19th-century Serbian music. Although he was a doctor by profession, he received his music education from an early age, actively working all his life as a composer, pianist, music pedagogue, and publicist. In this first printed edition of Jovan Paču's rhapsodies for piano, eight out of twelve rhapsodies are presented, the manuscript of which is kept in the Archives of the Institute of Musicology of the Serbian Academy of Sciences and Arts in Belgrade. The rhapsodies were selected based on the existing piano recordings of our renowned pianists and piano pedagogues (Zorica Dimitrijević Stošić, Dušan Trbojević, Dubravka Jovičić, Mirjana Šuica Babić). All recordings were kindly provided by the Radio Belgrade Sound Archive. Participants in the edition launch event: Danica Petrović PhD, Nataša Marjanović PhD, Dorian Leljak PhD, Marijana Kokanović Marković PhD and Dubravka Jovičić PhD.

Moreover, November 8, 2013, was proclaimed "Dr. Evren Kutlay Day" by the Mayor of Houston, Texas. She was a Visiting Scholar at Rutgers University in 2019. She is the Newell Scholar of 2024 at Georgia College and State University. She was the President of WPTA-Turkey and is a permanently authorized WPTA International Piano Competition judge.

ANNA OUSPENSKAYA (USA)

Virtual Concert Halls, co-Founder WPTA Washington, President

Anna Ouspenskaya is a Russian-born American concert pianist with extensive performance career spanning nearly 50 years of concertising throughout the world as a soloist with orchestras, in recitals, as a member of numerous chamber groups, and in collaboration with artists from many countries. Anna was born and spent early childhood in the Russian city of Yaroslavl on the tall banks of the magnificent Volga river, with its vast and powerful waters, snowy winters, and long mellow subtle summers. Russian spacious nature, its profoundly philosophical literature, its passionate and tragic music shaped Anna's personality and artistry as much as her early experiences learning piano from the best musicians in the country. A passionate propagandist of culture was forged through Anna's early struggles with the Soviet Union's oppressive regime and her family's status as "descendants of the enemies of the state". Her father was a symphony conductor, and her mother a violinist. Anna started her career as a concert pianist at the age of 8 performing the Haydn Piano Concerto with Yaroslavl Philharmonic. While a student at the famed Moscow Conservatory School for Gifted Children and later at the St Petersburg Conservatory Ms Ouspenskaya traveled throughout the former Soviet Union performing with orchestras and giving solo recitals. With the fall of the Soviet Union the doors opened to the rest of the world, and since then Ms Ouspenskaya performed in the US, Europe, Aisa, and the Middle East. After immigrating to the United States in 1998 Ms Ouspenskaya became interested in chamber music and continues to perform with musicians from the best and most prestigious orchestras such at the Kennedy Center National Symphony, Washington National Opera, Philadelphia Symphony, New York Philharmonic, among many others.

Classical Musicians and Competitions in the Modern Times

As times change, technology propels forward, generating enormous additional opportunities for music to be heard and enjoyed by more people than ever - what are the paths for musicians upwards, both in education and career? Hundreds if not thousands of competitions are out there nowadays, is this a good thing or a bad thing? The answer is - it can be both. DUO PETROF - ANATOLY ZATIN & VLADA VASSILIEVA (MEXICO)

Universidad de Colima (Colima, Col., Mexico) WPTA Piano Duo, Presidents

After performing together for two decades years, Mexican pianists of soviet origin Anatoly Zatin and Vlada Vassilieva have developed their own concept of the piano duo as stage genre by creating and performing their own arrangements. Their many awards in the world of classical music include the first prize at the international competition for professional piano duos in the United States (2018), a nomination for the 2016 Hollywood Music in Media Awards for their iconic two piano version of El Jarabe Tapatio, and the title of Contemporary-Classical ensemble of the year by the 2016 Mexican Music Awards in New York City. Their last album, Anatoly Zatin: works for piano, received two gold medals at the 2023 Global Music Awards and Duo Petrof were named Best of show. Previously, three of their albums received silver medals at this prestigious competition. Their recordings on Columna Musica and Playaudio are available on most streaming platforms. Duo Petrof (founded in 2003) is an ensemble in residence at the University of Colima in Mexico, where both



pianists also teach. Anatoly Zatin graduated as composer, pianist, and conductor from the Leningrad Conservatory of Music; he is winner of international music competitions and frequent performer at the most important music festivals around the globe. He was awarded the prestigious Mozart Medal in 2015 and the UNICEF Medal of Honour in 1990 for his activities as pianist and conductor. His partner Vlada Vassilieva is winner of the 2010 Nadia Reisenberg piano award in New York City, among several other international piano competitions, and Fulbright Garcia Robles grantee during her graduate studies at Mannes College. Anatoly Zatin and Vlada Vassilieva work together not only as piano-duo but also as conductor-soloist team. They are members of the Petrof Art Family, of the International Academy of Performing Arts and Sciences, and of the International Piano Duo Association in Japan. They are proud ambassadors of Petrof Pianos worldwide.

French pianist Antoine Pichon was recently featured on BBC Radio 3 In Tune to perform works by Lili Boulanger and Mel Bonis. He has had the opportunity to perform in 13 European countries. Following two recitals at the World Piano Conference in Novi Sad, Serbia, and the Festival Off in Colmar, France, he has been invited to perform again in Colmar in 2018. In August 2018 he toured in Austria, Germany, Slovenia, Croatia, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Serbia as part of the "colluvio" chamber music course. After studying at the Mozarteum University Salzburg and the Royal College of Music (London), Antoine Pichon is a Masters student at the Royal Conservatoire in Brussels. His teachers include Niel Immelman and George Kern. In 2018, he won 3rd prize ex aequo at the WPTA International Piano Competition and the Yamaha special prize for the most interesting interpretation of a work by F. PETRA SPASOJEVIĆ (SERBIA)

Isidor Bajić Music School (Novi Sad)

Petra Spasojević was born on the 22nd of December, 2004 in Kuršumlija. Due to the need for special education, caused by the commonly named "incubator blindness", at the age of six she moved to Novi Sad to attend classes at the elementary school "Dr. Milan Petrović." Petra was inclusively involved in regular classes at the elementary school "Sonja Marinković", which she successfully completed in the 2018/2019 school year. In 2014, she enrolled in the Music School "Isidor Bajić", in Novi Sad, to study piano lessons in Ana Frlin's class. At this moment, Petra is a second-grade student at the "Isidor Bajić" Music High School. During her previous seven years of schooling, Petra participated in numerous domestic and international piano competitions, where she won the highest recognitions and awards. Of all awards, she would highlight the "Special Award for Author's Work", which is the first prize in the international competition for her composition in 2020. In addition, the maximum number of points on most competitions and two laureate titles at the "Festival of Pianism" in Sremska Mitrovica and the "Festival Isidor Bajić" in Novi Sad can also be added to the list of her achievements. There is a large number of performances behind Petra's huge success, and this love for the stage motivates her to improve herself and conquer the hearts of the audience with her music. Consequently, as her most triumphant debut, she particularly singles out her first solo concert in her town Kuršumlija, when she was only twelve. In 2019, at the



age of 14, she performed as a soloist accompanied by the Youth Philharmonic in the Novi Sad Synagogue, under the baton of a conductor Tamara Adamov Petijević. Then, in 2020, as a representative of Serbia, she performed at the competition "Virtuosos V4 + We play in the same language" in Budapest, where she won two major awards, "The Special Award and The Audience Award". Afterwards, she performed at Kolarac, at the concert of a world-renowned violinist Nemanja Radulivić. Furthermore, in May 2021, she held a concert in Niš, accompanied by the Niš Symphony Orchestra and conducted by Milena Injac. In September 2022, she held a concert in North Macedonia and for the first time at the concert she performed her piano cover of the Macedonian folk song in the style of classical music "Majedonsko Devojče" and delighted the audience. At the concert, which was six days after the concert in Macedonia, in Novi Sad, Serbia, she held a concert within the Kaleidoscope of Culture, which was supported by the European Capital of Culture Novi Sad 2022, and showed all her talents. While collaborating with a composer Dorotea Vejnović, Petra enters the world of composition and hopes that her works will soon reach larger audiences. Her wish is to grow as a pianist and a composer, and to show the world how boundaries and prejudice can be broken when you sincerely love what you do.



In December 2017, Zvjezdan won the first absolute prize on 12° Ars nova Trieste International Music Festival (Italy) and 2nd prize at the Cesar Franck piano competition in Kraainem, Belgium. In 2018 Zvjezdan won the first prize in "Isidor Bajić" piano competition in Novi Sad, Serbia. In 2019. in the EPTA competition in Croatia he has won first prize. He has performed as a soloist and as a member of a piano duo throughout Croatia and Europe. As a soloist, he has performed with the North Bohemian Orchestra in the Czech Republic and with the Karlovac Chamber Orchestra. Zvjezdan was declared as the best young musician in the 2019/20120 season in the cycle of concerts of young musicians organized by Jeunesses Musicales Croatia, Split, Croatia. In the period of restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, from the autumn of 2020 he participates in online competitions in different age categories in different European countries. He won 17 first prizes and was even declared a laureate six times. Zvjezdan is the winner of two Oscars of knowledge from the Ministry of Science and Education in Croatia. From the school year 2020/21. he is a scholarship holder of the City of Zagreb for excellence.

As a scholarship holder of the Anne-Sophie Mutter foundation and winner of the ECHO Classic award, double bassist Dominik Wagner is presenting his instrument from a new perspective on an international basis. He won prizes at almost all double bass competitions, including the renowned ARD Music Competition, the Eurovision Young Musicians Competition and the International Bradetich Competition. As a soloist Dominik played with many orchestras, such as the BR-Symphony Orchestra, the WDR-Symphony Orchestra and the German Chamber Philharmonic Orchestra Bremen in prestigious concert halls, among them the Musikverein Wien, Konzerthaus Wien, Konzerthaus Berlin, Herkulessaal München and the Elbphilharmonie Hamburg. The highlights of 2021 were the release of his first Solo CD "Giovanni Bottesini - Revolution of Bass" with the Label Berlin Classics, performances of Georg Breinschmid's double bass concerto with the Württembergisches Kammerorchester Heilbronn and the Camerata Salzburg and multiple world premieres, one of them by Wolfram Wagner at the Elbphilharmonie Hamburg. An important part of his career is

expanding and enriching the repertoire for double bass. This led to numerous premieres of concertos, chamber music and pieces for double bass solo. Furthermore, he regularly arranges music by composers ranging from J.S. Bach all the way to George Gershwin. Besides his engagements as a soloist, Dominik shows great passion for playing chamber music. In addition to the standard pieces, he creates new constellations and explores new repertoire. Consequently, he formed the duo with the jazz-double bassist Georg Breinschmid and the clarinet trio with Vera Karner and Aurelia Visovan, which was awarded with the "Fanny Mendelssohn Förderpreis". Despite his young age, Dominik is also a sought-after pedagogue. As such, he regularly gives masterclasses in different parts of Europe (Austria, Germany, Sweden, Holland, UK) and the US. Born in Vienna in 1997 he started his musical education at the age of 5, at first as a cellist, later as a double bassist. Another important musical influence was being part of the Vienna Boys Choir from 2007 to 2011. In the year 2009 he started studying at the University of Music and Performing Arts Vienna with Josef Niederhammer and Werner Fleischmann, as of 2015 onwards at the University of Music in Nürnberg with Dorin Marc.

Dina Šuklar Wiesike holds degrees in Piano Performance from Syracuse University, NY, USA (M.Mus) and Novi Sad University Academy of Arts, Serbia (B.A.), where she studied under the tutelage of Wei-Yi Yang and Dorian Leljak, respectively. During her studies she was recognized with the most prestigious awards of both universities (the Academy of Arts Best Student Award in 2002; the University of Novi Sad Best Student Award in 2003; the Hira Poncha Memorial Award; the Elizabeth Garnach Memorial Award, etc.), and was awarded numerous competitive scholarships (Serbian Ministry of Education Student Scholarship, Privrednik Student Scholarship, Syracuse University Scholarship, UK Connections Fund Protégé, Norwegian Government Promising Talent Award for Serbian Students, etc.). 

Music Starter (Book Presentation): A New Method of Learning How to Read Music


Music Starter has been described as "A first-rate music tool that would greatly enhance the way we approach beginners' music instruction" (Dr. Dorian Leljak, WPTA President), "A wonderfully unique book with all the elements to ultimately instill a lifelong love of music!" (Dr. Maria Kotitsa, C Psychol, Regent's College, London, UK), "One of the nicest and most significant achievements of our piano pedagogy" (Rita Kinka, Academy of Arts, Novi Sad). The book is designed to help children learn basic symbols of music notation through playing games (including stickers, cards, a board game, etc.), solving logic problems, reading stories, etc. It encourages children to discover the meaning of each symbol of music notation, enabling them to acquire elemental music literacy in a meaningful, creative, and exciting way. The tasks are carefully organized so that a child gradually moves from what is known to him/her towards the unknown. Mechanical repetition is avoided since each task in a lesson in unique, which helps children gain a more profound understanding of the concepts presented, while maintaining their concentration levels and interest in the book. With each problem solved and game finished, children take one step closer to understanding the essential music parameters and their symbols (rhythm, meter, pitch, registers, etc.).

Isidor Bajić Music School (Novi Sad)



Born October 2012 in Novi Sad. Marko Živković learned to read very early, at the age of two. He joined a preschool children's choir "Družiciranje" at the age of three, where Professor Ana Kovačić and Professor Marija Đokić noticed his unusual interest in music theory. Individual piano lessons started, at the age of 4, with Professor Milena Apić from May 2017. At the same age, he started creating compositions on a mobile phone composition program. The largest number of compositions were for piano and then followed compositions for two pianos and later for multiple instruments. Today, as he gains more knowledge about the musical instruments and harmony, he uses modern scoring programs writing compositions even for a symphonic orchestra. He had his first public performance in October 2017. Now he is fourth grade student of "Đorđe Natošević" elementary school in Novi Sad and fifth grade student of "Isidor Bajić" music school in Novi Sad, in Professor Milena Apić piano class.
